2nd RurAllure General Meeting

2nd General Meeting of the rurAllure, European Union financed project, took place on 8 - 10 September 2021 in Vila do Conde, Portugal, in parallel with the rurAllure International Congress. Consortium members met to discuss the advancement of the project, which objective is the promotion of cultural heritage and museums in rural context along the main pilgrimage routes in Europe.

The event, marking recent launch of the project pilots, was attended by more than 20 representatives from the 16 members of the rurAllure international Consortium.

The event, organized by the Municipality of Vila do Conde and coordinated by the University of Vigo, was focused on the project follow-up, future strategies, project sustainability and long-term goals. The rurAllure dissemination and outreach plan, submitted to the European Commission in June 2021, was presented to the participants. The progress of the four pilots, which were also officially launched in June, was reviewed by the members of the Consortium. The beta-version of the technological platform was presented by GVAM, project IT partner.

The General Meeting was held in parallel with the rurAllure International Scientific Congress, which aimed to problematize the use of current information technologies in the tourism sector, enhancing a differentiating experience of place, around heritage. Attended by prominent scholars and researchers, such as Jordi Tresseras, Lúcia Rosas, Carolina Sousa, Mariana Cardoso da Silva, José María Lucas Tobajas, the event gathered more than 100 participants.

"It is no coincidence that Vila do Conde has been chosen for this important event: it is the city of poets and artists who contribute to enhancing and enriching the experience of travelers and pilgrims", declared Maria Elisa Ferraz, Vila do Conde mayor, underlining the economic, social and cultural impact of pilgrimages and their importance for the promotion of slow tourism.

Walking is a current tourism trend, which provides an opportunity for pilgrimage and cultural routes to promote their tourism offers, enhance cultural heritage along the paths and provide economic benefits to rural areas outside of tourist circuits.
